

Saturday, August 12, Richland Creek Wildlife Management Area, 7:00am

A Limited Public Use Permit is required to enter the WMA.

If the Game Warden finds you without one you will be told to leave.

You can purchase one where hunting licenses are sold - Walmart, Academy, Cabella, etc.

Be sure to tell them you want **item #175** (They don't know about them)

Limited use permit is \$12 or you may buy a Senior Resident Hunting license for \$7.00

Texas license cycle runs from September 1 of a given year through Aug 31 of the next year.

A license purchased now will be good only through Aug 31, 2017.

- 1) Click on the "Purchase Online" link to the upper right side of the page
 - 2) The next page is titled "Texas License Connection". Click on the "Purchase Items" button
 - 3) You will enter your last name, date of birth, and one of four other identifies. Most people will use either SSN or TX Driver's License.
 - 4) Confirm your info on the next page and click "Start Shopping"
 - 5) The next page is titled "Recreational Sales". Click on "Miscellaneous"
 - 6) Select Item #175 Limited Public Use Permit (\$12.00)
 - 7) Select "Checkout" (unless you want to purchase additional licenses)
 - 8) Fill out your shipping info on the next page and click "Continue to Billing"
 - 9) Enter your payment (credit card info) on the next page.
 - 10) Confirm your purchase on the next page.
 - 11) Print the Confirmation Page - it contains your Transaction Number and serves as your temporary license. You will also get an email with this info. This will serve as your permit until it arrives in the mail.
- The total cost is \$17: \$12 + a \$5 administrative fee.**

100% of your hunting and fishing license fees go to the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department for on-the-ground conservation efforts that help make Texas one of the best places in the country to hunt and fish.
